Application

This unit of competency has been developed for post trade engineering fabrication training and the recognition of post trade skills in setting and editing computer controlled thermal cutting machines.

It defines the skills and knowledge required to select and set appropriate work holding fixtures, determine and set thermal cutting nozzle controls, and to trial and complete the setting of the machine as defined by the unit in conjunction with its prerequisites.

Where advanced manual thermal cutting, gouging and shaping is required, the unit MEM05071 Perform advanced manual thermal cutting, gouging and shaping should also be selected.

Where setting and editing other computer controlled machines is required, the unit MEM07016 Set and edit computer controlled machines and processes should also be selected.

Where the selection and use of power tools/handheld operations is required, the unit MEM18002 Use power tools/hand held operations should also be selected.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

accessing program in edit mode in situ in order to make changes associated with:

- gas mixtures
- nozzle or work piece feed speed
- operational sequence.

Computer controlled thermal cutting machines include one or more of the following:

- fuel/gas machines
- plasma machines
- laser machines.
