Application

This unit of competency defines the skills and knowledge required to produce detailed engineering drawings for reticulated services to Australian Standard (AS) 1100.101 Technical drawing – General principles and is primarily for those performing drafting work within the air conditioning and mechanical services industry related to the installation of reticulated services in commercial and industrial buildings.

Critical dimensions and specifications for the drawing are predetermined and drawings are carried out with or without the use of computer-aided design (CAD) systems.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Range of Conditions

This field allows for different work environments and conditions that may affect performance. Essential operating conditions that may be present (depending on the work situation, needs of the candidate, accessibility of the item, and local industry and regional contexts) are included.

Available information includes one or more of the following:	• construction documents • building and coordination information • work specifications • information for plant services equipment • design brief.
Reticulated systems include one or more of the following:	• hot and cold water systems • steam and condensate systems • heating/chilled and condenser water systems • compressed air systems

	• natural and LPG systems • pipe work insulation • flues, ducts and insulation.
Operational features and working principles of reticulated system components include one or more of the following:	• variable refrigerant volume (VRV) systems • refrigeration systems • slab heating/cooling • hydronic heating • chilled beams • medical gases • fittings/valve types: • strainer • balancing • isolating • non-return • pumps • air side: • fans • dampers • registers • filters • air handling units • VAV units • domestic hot and cold water systems • steam and condensate systems • heating/chilled and condenser water systems • compressed air systems • gas systems • insulation.
Codes, standards and industry regulations include one or more of the following:	• AS/NZS 1668 The use of ventilation and air conditioning in buildings • AS 1682.1 Fire smoke and air dampers Specification • AS 4254 Ductwork for air-handling systems in buildings • building codes • WHS codes of practice • utilities regulations.
Industry standards include one or more of the following:	• National Construction Code (NCC) • Australian Standards (AS) • legislation requirements from Building Practitioner's Board (BPB) • Sheet Metal and Air Conditioning Contractors National Association (SMACNA)
