- 3.1 Check to ensure identification labels, tags and stickers are correct and place/attach them in an appropriate manner
- 3.2 Store packaged items in a safe, orderly and retrievable manner and record the location in the warehouse/store

- procedures undertaken, including one (1) or more of the following:
 - standards
 - codes

- packaging material determined from instructions - written or verbal

Storage conditions, site and legislative requirements include the following:

- legislative requirements e.g. dangerous goods and storage of poisons acts and regulations
