Application

The team may have a single leader or shared leadership and would be responsible for all aspects of its designated function within operating parameters and constraints, and members would have day-to-day responsibility for managing themselves and the technical aspects of their work.

Where an individual works with others, such as within a section or department, unit MEM13015 Work safely and effectively in manufacturing and engineering should be regarded as sufficient.

- team roles and behaviours
- team maintenance

Individual differences include one (1) or more of the following:

- ethnicity
- age
- gender
- ability / disability
- opinions / beliefs
- sexual orientation
- language
- status in the organisation
- level of expertise
