Assessment Requirements for MEM19018 Repair jewellery items

Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least two (2) occasions and include:

- following work instructions, standard operating procedures (SOPs) and safe work practices
- obtaining information and advice required to assess item and conducting condition assessment
- selecting the appropriate repair technique in accordance with item construction and identifying repair requirements
- carrying out repairs using appropriate tools and equipment
- identifying and addressing unforeseen effects and minimising evidence of repair work
- finalising the repair and documenting repair work in accordance with SOPs.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate the required knowledge for this unit must be relevant to and satisfy the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- safe work practices and procedures and use of personal protective equipment (PPE)
- techniques and information sources available for assessing jewellery items
- limitations in capacity to repair items
- repair techniques suitable for jewellery items
- potential effects of repair work to stones and components
- reasons for selecting particular metals, construction methods, repair, manufacturing and finishing techniques.

Assessment Conditions

- Assessors must:
 - have vocational competency in repairing jewellery items at least to the level being assessed with relevant industry knowledge and experience
 - satisfy the assessor requirements in the *Standards for Registered Training Organisations 2015* or its replacement and comply with the *National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011*, its replacement or equivalent legislation covering VET regulation in a non-referring state/territory as the case requires

- Where possible assessment must occur in operational workplace situations. Where this is not possible or where personal safety or environmental damage are limiting factors, assessment must occur in a sufficiently rigorous simulated environment that reflects realistic operational workplace conditions. This must cover all aspects of workplace performance, including environment, task skills, task management skills, contingency management skills and job role environment skills
- Conditions for assessment must include access to all tools, equipment, materials and documentation required, including relevant workplace procedures, product and manufacturing specifications
- Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.
