Where advanced processes are needed for pre-cutting gemstones, unit MEM19067 Apply advanced pre-cutting processes to complex gemstones should also be selected.

This unit applies to individuals processing gemstones in a small or large-scale production context. They use and adapt technical knowledge and skills in the pre-cutting process.

5. Process gemstone to pre-form state	5.1 Grind stone to the desired shape 5.2 Check stone for internal flaws and correct in accordance with job requirements

Range of Conditions

Specifications include one or more of the following:	• client requirements • job sheets • work instructions.
Determining gemstone-buying preferences includes one or more of the following:	• accessing internet auction sites • accessing internet gemstone-specific sites • making contact with gemstone dealers • making contact with gemstone cutters • phoning jewellery wholesalers and other jewellers • talking with local jewellery store owners • targeting specialist gemstone stores.
Relevant information to be recorded includes:	• date of purchase • description of stone (including weight and size) • description of area where mined • purchase price • vendor.
Equipment includes one or more of the following:	• cleaning equipment • diamond grinder • diamond saw • free-hand saw • silicon carbide grinder • slab saw • trim saw.
Unwanted material includes one or more of the following:	• cracked material • iron stone • materials with inclusions or stains • matrix • poor colour • potch • sandstone.
WHS principles and safe operating procedures include:	• complying with safe operating procedures for each machine • good housekeeping • avoiding contaminants • using personal protective equipment (PPE) where required.
