Unwanted material includes one or more of the following:	• cotton and gypsum • cracked material • crockery • iron stone • materials with inclusions or stains • matrix (in gemstone as an unwanted inclusion) • poor colour • potch • sandstone.
Advanced pre-cutting and pre-forming processes apply to one or more of the following:	• boulder • black • especially valuable gemstones • difficult gemstone.
