Application

5. Finalise entry and reinstatement process	5.1 Clean work area, tools and equipment and store in accordance with SOPs 5.2 Instruct customer in accordance with job needs, organisational procedures and manufacturer recommendations 5.3 Complete documentation, and process in accordance with legislative and organisational requirements

Foundation Skills

Range of Conditions

Personal protective equipment (PPE) includes one or more of the following:	• face protection • hearing protection • dust masks and respirators • high-visibility clothing • head protection • sun protection • gloves • knee pads • safety footwear • witches hats • warning signs and warning tapes • temporary safety barriers • fire extinguisher • first aid kit.
Appropriate sources of information include one or more of the following:	• catalogues • manufacturer manuals • drawings • detailed or technical sketches • industry colleagues or experts • computer software • associated data sheets.
Entry method includes one or more of the following:	• pick • impressioning • reading and decoding • manipulating linkages • alternative methods.

Tools and equipment include one or more of the following:	• hand tools specific to gaining entry • special-purpose equipment.
Materials and consumables include one or more of the following:	• lubricants • cleaning materials.
Documentation includes one or more of the following:	• procedures and measurements for opening specific vehicles • job sheets • invoices.
