Range of Conditions

This field allows for different work environments and conditions that may affect performance. Essential operating conditions that may be present (depending on the work situation, needs of the candidate, accessibility of the item, and local industry and regional contexts) are included.

Chronograph watch mechanisms include one (1) or more of the following:

- types - application of dial scale indications:
 - tachymeter
 - telemeter
- chronograph operating systems:
 - pillar wheel actuated
 - cam controlled
- features:
 - minute record
 - hour record
 - automatic
 - split second

Appropriate working environment includes the following:

- adequate lighting and ventilation
- clean bench and working area
- tools and equipment organised and in good condition
- ergonomic seating

Record and document repair includes one (1) or more of the following:

- date and extent of repair
- cost of replacement part
- time spent on procedure

Dismantling and assembly precautions include one (1) or more of the following:

- inspection of condition and adjustments of chronograph assembly functions
- verification of correct recording system operation:
 - engagement
 - depthing
 - end shake
 - penetration
- correct selection, application and amount of lubrication for chronograph mechanisms
- adjustment of timekeeping performance and balance amplitude during chronograph function

Chronograph components include one (1) or more of the following:

- operating mechanism (single or double pusher action)
- clutch system for chronograph engagement
- transmission (minute or hour record)
- flyback and zeroing

This field allows for different work environments and conditions that may affect performance. Essential operating conditions that may be present (depending on the work situation, needs of the candidate, accessibility of the item, and local industry and regional contexts) are included.

Chronograph action includes one (1) or more of the following:

- start, stop, reset to zero
- hand zeroing
- indexing minute and hour record

Dial and hand fitting includes one (1) or more of the following:

- hand fitting tools and supports
- alignments and synchronisation

Watch performance and rate testing includes one (1) or more of the following:

- beat error diagnosis and adjustment
- rate adjustment/positional errors
- amplitude (chronograph start - maximum variation +/- 40 degrees)

Hand tools and equipment include one (1) or more of the following:

- movement holders for operating chronograph functions
- timing machine
- rose cutters
- tools for removing chronograph driving wheel
- hand staking and fitting tools and supports
- case opening and closing tools
