Release 1. Supersedes and is equivalent to MEM23149A Contribute to the design of commercial and industrial exhaust systems.

Application

This unit of competency defines the skills and knowledge required to contribute to the design of commercial and industrial exhaust systems, including industrial dust extraction systems or to undertake the complete design for less complex systems. Commercial and industrial exhaust systems include those designed to manage dust, fumes, explosive gases or noxious gases.

The unit applies to technicians in organisations that design whole commercial and industrial exhaust systems or undertake design modifications to existing systems as part of manufacturing, installation, commissioning, servicing and maintenance activities.

It applies to design work undertaken as part of a design team comprising engineers and other technicians and to individual design tasks within the scope of the technician's skill and knowledge.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

requirements include:	• correct handling and disposal of liquid and solid waste • elimination or minimisation of gas, fume, vapour and smoke emissions, including fugitive emissions • dust elimination, minimisation and control • minimisation of energy and water use • elimination or control of excessive noise • use and recycling of refrigerants.
Appropriate personnel include:	• supervisor, leading hand, foreman or manager • engineer • technician • trainer or mentor • team member • customer.
Resources include:	• relevant codes • manufacturer specifications.
Organisational procedures include:	• use of tools and equipment • instructions, including job sheets, plans, drawings and designs • reporting and communication • manufacturer specifications • operational procedures • industry standards.
Equipment includes:	• computer workstation and software, either stand alone or networked • test apparatus • appropriate tools of trade, equipment and materials.
