Engine firing pressure control adjustment methods include the following:

- reflashing of electronic control module (ECM) unit where electronic control is used
- manual adjustment of:
 - governor rack travel
 - torque spring load limit
 - over speed trips
 - aneroid or fuel ratio control to specification
