Release 1. Supersedes and is equivalent to MSFFL2030 Receive and prepare flooring materials. Changes to application, elements and performance criteria to improve clarity and consistency across MSFFL units. Changes to assessment requirements.

Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to check, prepare, package, transport and load flooring materials to an installation site with minimum damage. It includes acclimatisation and storage of materials onsite and is limited to the use of non-regulated moving devices (such as hand trolleys and pallette jacks). Categories of flooring materials may include carpet, resilient, resin, timber, terrazzo and polished concrete. Each category also includes materials other than the actual flooring materials that are necessary for the installation of the flooring material (for example, in the instance of carpet, adhesives, underlay and grippers).

Workers with this competency undertake routine tasks on residential and non-residential/commercial sites according to job instructions including plans and specifications and workplace procedures using discretion, judgement and problem-solving to identify and resolve routine issues. They work with a high degree of self-direction under routine supervision, and they are responsible for their output.

The work described in this unit may require a licence or certification in some jurisdictions, and state or territory authorities should be consulted to determine the current status. Workers on construction sites are required by law to complete induction training. They must also comply with relevant legislation, regulations, Australian Standards, codes and manufacturer installation instructions.
