Application

This unit of competency covers the skills and knowledge required to make an object from metal in accordance with the requirements of an established design in a simulated or trial manufacturing environment where there is a high degree of direct supervision.

This unit applies to learners seeking practical skills that are relevant and useful to the area in which the learner hopes to gain employment, is currently working, and/or as a pathway to further study.

This unit applies to a learning and assessment environment where access to normal production operations is not available. Typically this will be a VET in Schools delivery environment but it may be another simulated or trial manufacturing environment where a high degree of supervision exists. Students may be on work placement.

The unit must be applied to a specific 'project' or task which has a defined beginning, middle and end, occurs over an extended period of time, and is relevant to the manufacturing industry.

When delivered/assessed as part of a qualification the unit must be customised to ensure its relevance to real or simulated work activities and related workplaces.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Foundation Skills

This section describes those language, literacy, numeracy and employment skills that are essential to performance.

Range of Conditions

This field allows for different work environments and conditions that may affect performance. Essential operating conditions that may be present (depending on the work situation, needs of the candidate, accessibility of the item, and local industry and regional contexts) are included.

Metal

Metal includes one or more of the following:

- mild steel
- galvanised steel
- stainless steel
- aluminium
- brass

Metal object

A metal object includes one or more of the following:

- a small decorative box, with or without a lid
- desk pencil holder
- metallic photo album
- cabinet
- shelving

- CD rack
- metallic picture frame

Work instructions

Work instructions include one or more of the following:

- job sheets
- patterns
- plans
- drawings and sketches
- verbal or illustrated directions from supervisor
- number and type of objects to be produced
- quality requirements
- WHS requirements
- environmental requirements

WHS requirements

WHS requirements include one or more of the following:

- legislative requirements
- hazardous and dangerous goods codes
- safe operating procedures
- specific workplace rules regarding PPE, such as disposable overalls, dust mask, eye and ear protection, and gloves

Suitable work area

A suitable work area includes one or more of the following:

- workbench
- desk or table
- workshop
- shed
- durable space

Appropriate tools, equipment and materials

Appropriate tools, equipment and materials include one or more of the following:

- measuring tapes or rulers
- hammers
- mallets
- squares
- bevels
- chisels
- files

- planes
- hand saws
- cordless drills/screwdrivers
- fixing and joining devices
- jigs
- clamping devices
- pincers
- power saws
- power drills
- band saws
- vertical drill presses
- PPE
- metal
- adhesives
- screws
- nuts
- bolts
- hinges and metal fasteners
- pencils and markers
- paints

Potential hazards

Potential hazards include one or more of the following:

- broken or faulty equipment
- unnoticed sharp objects
- poor lighting
- inadequate ventilation
- inadequate attention to the activities of others
- electrical shortages and power overload
- disorganised or cluttered workspace (poor housekeeping)
- poor attention when dealing with tools and equipment
- environmental chemicals, heat, dust, noise, gas and oil

Workplace records

Workplace records include one or more of the following:

- plant and maintenance records
- job cards
- check sheets
- reporting requirements
- documenting equipment and/or material defects
- workplace procedures relating to the use of tools and

equipment

Specifications

Specifications include one or more of the following:

- measurements and dimensions
- joining methods
- quality standards
- materials to be used

Preparing edges and surfaces

Preparing edges and surfaces includes one or more of the following:

- filing
- sanding
- cleaning
- grinding
- polishing

Joining metal pieces

Joining metal pieces includes one or more of the following

- screws, rivets, nuts and bolts
- hinging
- soldering

Rectifying non-conformities

Rectifying non-conformities includes one or more of the following:

- deconstructing the assembled pieces
- reshaping, resizing or re-cutting elements
- reassembling elements

Finishing work

Finishing work includes one or more of the following:

- filing
- polishing
- grinding
- painting and decorating
