#### **Performance Evidence**

There must be evidence the candidate has completed the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit, and:

- stored materials for production on at least 1 occasion, including:
  - performing checks and measurements to store materials and maintain quantity, quality, physical and chemical state
  - recognising possible causes of the following routine problems:
    - equipment failure, faults and abnormalities
    - raw material variations
    - procedure errors.

## **Knowledge Evidence**

There must be evidence the candidate has knowledge of:

- principles of safe and efficient storage
- types of materials commonly stored in the work environment and their characteristics
- impact of contamination
- principles of operation of transfer system and equipment
- testing procedures
- manual handling techniques and ergonomics
- safe storage of dangerous goods and hazardous materials
- · transport requirements and restrictions for products and materials
- routine problems, their probable causes and relevant corrective actions
- storage hazards and:
  - their possible causes
  - potential consequences
  - risk control procedures.

#### **Assessment Conditions**

Skills must have been demonstrated in the workplace or in a simulated environment that reflects workplace conditions and contingencies. The following conditions must be met for this unit:

- use of suitable facilities, equipment and resources, including:
  - storage equipment and ancillary equipment
  - materials to be stored
  - · specifications, procedures and job sheets
- modelling of industry operating conditions, including:
  - routine and non-routine problems.

Assessors must satisfy the NVR/AQTF mandatory competency requirements for assessors.
