Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to lead processes to determine and implement changes in the supply chain which support circularity.

This unit applies to managers, supply chain specialists, technical specialists or similar roles with authority and influence to drive change through specific initiatives. The individual will map the supply chain for a process, product or service, identify opportunities for improved circularity, facilitate others' understanding of and engagement with circularity, lead the implementation of improvements and help to embed the improvements within the organisation.

In this unit, the supply chain focus is on the procurement and/or management of infrastructure, resources and/or services for the organisation to deliver its core functions, products and/or services.

For the purposes of this unit, circularity refers to the application of decisions and activities designed to move the organisation towards a non-waste scenario that is in equilibrium and which supports regeneration of natural systems. Circularity improvements will typically align to one or more aspects of the currently accepted frameworks of 3 Circular Economy principles and 5 Circular Economy business models.

This unit applies to any organisation.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.
