This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to read and interpret navigational aids to locate position and determine and navigate safe and efficient routes to urban and regional and remote destinations.

This unit applies to environmental technicians, environmental officer, technicians, operators and other roles who are required to plan and navigate routes using maps, aerial photos, plans, charts and global positioning system (GPS) equipment.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Navigate in regional and remote areas	3.1 Orientate map with surroundings 3.2 Identify field position and destination on map using landforms, landmarks and navigation equipment 3.3 Use navigation aids, equipment and maps to follow planned route and schedule 3.4 Use alternate routes to avoid hazards, safely bypass obstacles or improve efficiency of route 3.5 Maintain communication in accordance with workplace procedures

Foundation Skills
