Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to process, interrogate and interpret environmental data and report results.

This unit applies to environmental technicians and similar roles who are required to perform scientific calculations, analyse trends and uncertainty in data, identify aberrant data, and use standard statistical methods to interpret data and present results.

The individual will solve problems where alternatives are not obvious and where investigations and trials may be required, and the implications of various solutions considered. A calculator or computer and software will typically be used but is not required.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Foundation Skills
