Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to design or redesign a process using a process layout as distinct from volume production layout (product layout).

This unit applies to technical experts who will apply the principles of competitive systems and practices to identify process boundaries and determine layout and infrastructure requirements and solutions with input from others.

This applies to any organisation implementing a process layout within competitive systems and practices.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Foundation Skills
