Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to safely operate machinery that supports basic assembly, production and finishing processes for textile products such as cutting, buttonholing, stud, fusing or gluing or backing machines. It does not include materials handling equipment, such as forklifts or specialised textile production machines for weaving, spinning, knitting, tufting, creeling or dyeing.

This unit applies to work that may be repetitive and require a limited range of operations.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.
