 - spinning
 - weaving.

Knowledge Evidence

There must be evidence the candidate has knowledge of:

- safe work practices and procedures and use of personal protective equipment (PPE)
- types of textile production processes, and required equipment and techniques used for fabric or product production:
 - felting
 - knitting
 - sewing
 - spinning
 - weaving
- types and styles of yarns used in textile production
- types of quality checks for textile items and how to respond to basic faults.

Assessment Conditions

Skills must have been demonstrated in the workplace or in a simulated environment that reflects workplace conditions and contingencies. The following conditions must be met for this unit:

- use of suitable facilities, equipment and resources, including:
 - simple textile designs
 - tools, equipment and materials
 - procedures for work health and safety.

Assessors must satisfy the NVR/AQTF mandatory competency requirements for assessors.
