Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to use stencil, lino cut, block, stamp or silk screen printing techniques to produce culturally-specific designs and artworks for fabrics. Fabrics may be used for artworks, apparel or other non-wearable textile products.

This unit specifically applies to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and should be customised to accommodate the image use and design protocols and techniques specific to an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander community.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.
