Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to lay up fabric and cut work as part of the textile production process in situations involving complex patterns, multiple layers, step layers and two-way markers. Fabrics may have directional patterns. Work may be completed using manual or computer-aided techniques.

This unit applies to individuals working in accordance with pre-determined specifications and established procedures using discretion and judgement to manage tasks involving some complexity.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Foundation Skills

- Writing skills to communicate simple factual information in familiar work documents
- Numeracy skills to interpret numerical information in specifications and use estimating skills to manipulate pattern pieces
