Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to select and use embellishing techniques for textile products either during or at the end of production. Products may be apparel or non-wearable items. Embellishments may be added by hand or machine.

This unit applies to individuals working in accordance with pre-determined specifications and established procedures.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Foundation Skills

- Reading skills to interpret familiar workplace procedures and work documentation
- Writing skills to communicate simple factual information in familiar workplace documents
- Numeracy skills to interpret numerical information in specifications and take accurate measurements to support embellishing tasks
