Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to set and use digital embroidery programs and machines to produce embroidered lettering, monograms and motifs on textile products.

This unit applies to individuals working in accordance with pre-determined specifications and established procedures. They use discretion, judgement and problem-solving skills to monitor work and adjust machines to achieve optimum outcomes.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Foundation Skills
