Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to apply complex textile printing techniques and processes when interpreting and responding to a specified design brief for products such as garments, fabrics, accessories, giftware or other domestic products. Complex techniques and processes are those which relate to issues such as layering, use of multiple screens, repeat printing and working back into the print with stitching, beading or use fabric manipulation.

This unit applies to textile designers.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Foundation Skills
