# Application

This unit of competency describes the skills and knowledge required to map and establish a supply chain process for a textiles, clothing or footwear (TCF) operation working with domestic or international suppliers and customers in the supply or receipt of products and services. It involves determining requirements, establishing commercial relationships, and working effectively within sector or organisational conditions, import/export regulations and resource requirements. This work is completed to support ethical supply chain management.

This unit applies to individuals working in senior design and/or production roles who apply initiative and judgement to build an effective supply chain.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.
