Performance Evidence

There must be evidence the candidate has completed the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit, and demonstrated the ability to:

- · select appropriate materials for five different manufactured textile jobs
- complete the following for five different materials:
 - locate and interpret technical information
 - follow safe handling procedures when inspecting, moving or storing materials.

Knowledge Evidence

There must be evidence the candidate has knowledge of:

- safe work practices and procedures for materials handling, including:
 - use of personal protective equipment (PPE)
 - manual handling techniques that support safe work practice and types, uses and limitations of tools and equipment used to support manual handling of products
 - · processes and communication protocols for team lifting
- · basic manufactured textile product construction principles and methods
- key aspects of materials used in the canvas and sail industry:
 - types, characteristics, uses and limitations of:
 - fibres and yarns
 - ropes
 - · dacron, nylon and composite sail cloths
 - attachments (metal and non-metal)
 - adhesives
 - industry applications of different materials
 - relative advantages and disadvantages of various materials for particular applications
 - joining characteristics of different materials

- quality indicators
- labelling principles and practices, including 'care' labelling
- storage and handling requirements and systems
- environmental protection and sustainability considerations
- workplace procedures for stock administration.

Assessment Conditions

Skills must have been demonstrated in the workplace or in a simulated environment that reflects workplace conditions and contingencies. The following conditions must be met for this unit:

- use of suitable facilities, equipment and resources, including:
 - work documentation
 - materials for textile fabrication products
 - storage areas
 - moving equipment
 - workplace procedures.

Assessors must satisfy the NVR/AQTF mandatory competency requirements for assessors.
