Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to use computer hardware and software to develop 2D patterns for the production of complex shapes in manufactured textile products. It requires the ability to create drawings, complete computerised cutting of shapes, use a plotting table, and calculate material requirements and costing.

This unit applies to individuals working in accordance with pre-determined specifications and established procedures.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Foundation Skills
