Performance Evidence

There must be evidence the candidate has completed the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit, and demonstrated the ability to:

- operate portable vulcanising equipment at least once to meet job specifications.

Knowledge Evidence

There must be evidence the candidate has knowledge of:

- the function of vulcanising equipment and machine components
- principles of operation of the equipment
- the criteria for overall process or equipment readiness for the process or equipment being used
- vulcanising workflow sequences
- changes to materials during the vulcanising process
- role of heat and pressure in relation to providing strength, stiffness, resistance to deformation, fatigue and abrasion
- key variables that may affect product quality and production output
- typical process and product problems, including early warning signs, possible causes and corrective actions:
 - incorrect set-up of vulcaniser
 - unsuccessful vulcanisation processes
- organisational procedures relevant to the work environment and job role, including procedures for the emergency shutdown of equipment
- hazards that may arise in the job or work environment, and:
 - their possible causes
 - potential consequences
 - appropriate risk controls.

Assessment Conditions

Skills must have been demonstrated in the workplace or in a simulated environment that reflects workplace conditions and contingencies.

Assessors must satisfy the NVR/AQTF mandatory competency requirements for assessors.
