# Assessment Requirements for PMBPROD281E Finish composite products

## Performance Evidence

There must be evidence the candidate has completed the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit, and demonstrated the ability to:

- finish composite products at least once to meet job specifications.

## Knowledge Evidence

There must be evidence the candidate has knowledge of:

- product quality requirements
- product defect classifications and signs of defects
- the criteria for overall process or equipment readiness for the process or equipment being used
- production workflow sequences and materials demand
- types and application of composites finishing processes
- typical tools and equipment used in finishing, including:
  - power tools including drills, grinders, sanders, polishers and routers
  - cutting tools
- methods of measuring surface finishes
- key variables that may affect product quality and production output
- typical process and product problems, as listed below, including early warning signs, possible causes and corrective actions:
  - warped products or components
  - surface defects
  - equipment wear and breakage
- organisational procedures relevant to the work environment or job role
- hazards that may arise in the job or work environment, and:
  - their possible causes
  - potential consequences
  - appropriate risk controls.

## Assessment Conditions

Skills must have been demonstrated in the workplace or in a simulated environment that reflects workplace conditions and contingencies.

Assessors must satisfy the NVR/AQTF mandatory competency requirements for assessors.
