Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to create polymer-matrix laminates or pre-moulding forms with vacuum-assisted closed-moulding equipment and materials.

This unit principally refers to the general use of process equipment in which liquid resin is applied to a dry lay-up of the reinforcement fabric or mat.
