Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to produce cored-laminate composite (sandwich-structured) products using specialised materials in a general industry application.

This unit applies to an experienced technician working alone or as part of a team.

The unit principally refers to the ability to apply laminating techniques to the structural engineering principles of beams and 'sandwich' panels.

No licensing or certification requirements exist at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.
