Application

This unit covers the skills and knowledge required to develop a new die or tool to meet a specified end use.

This unit applies to an advanced technologist, technical expert, or those in similar roles, in a lead role, typically as part of a product design, development and implementation team. The technologist is not required to demonstrate 'hands-on' operation of equipment as part of this competency.

The unit principally refers to the development of a new die or tool for a specified end use using the developer's application of their significant depth and breadth of knowledge of theoretical polymers, product and processes

No licensing or certification requirements apply to this unit of competency at the time of publication. Relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Trial new die and assess results	4.1 Design trialling procedure that delivers required information and is compliant with workplace procedures 4.2 Ensure work health and safety requirements are stringently observed during the production process 4.3 Coordinate trial of new die/tool 4.4 Guide die trial process and interpret trial results to assess if desired outcomes are achieved 4.5 Modify and refine process to optimise use of new die or tool

Foundation Skills
