Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to complete tasks outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit in the context of the job role, and:

- apply leadership and command in the context of leading operational groups for at least one patrol
- for the above patrol:
 - conduct research in the context of leading operational groups
 - read and interpret legislation, regulations, guidelines, policies and procedures relevant to the patrol
 - access and review written orders and patrol plan
 - apply procedures relevant to tasks undertaken at the group level
 - determine a response to diverse circumstances resulting from situational and resource changes
 - justify chosen response to any given situation against legislation, regulations, guidelines, policies and procedures.

Knowledge Evidence

Demonstrated knowledge required to complete the tasks outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit:

- enabling and allied legislation
- full range of regulatory powers enforceable by officers
- work health and safety and environment policies and guidelines
- operational command policy, methodology and principles
- legislation, regulations, guidelines, policies and procedures relating to command operations
- standing operating procedures and protocols
- operational environment including:
 - geographic location
 - transport mode
 - transaction
 - hours of operation
 - the human elements including, the officers, suspects, and persons who work, reside or visit in the environment

- the situation and intelligence
- workplace technology and equipment including trace detectors such as Ionscan and specialised X-ray equipment and related systems
- risk assessment techniques
- communication systems relevant to the workplace including communications network and radio protocols
- organisational and jurisdictional values, ethics and codes of conduct
- confidentiality, privacy and security issues
- reporting requirements.

Assessment Conditions

Skills must be demonstrated in the workplace or in a simulated environment that reflects workplace conditions.

Assessment must ensure access to:

- legislation, regulations, guidelines, policies and procedures relating to command operations
- standing operating procedures and protocols
- relevant resources and equipment required of the working environment.

Assessors must satisfy the Standards for Registered Training Organisations' requirements for assessors.
