Application

PERFORMANCE CRITERIA

Performance criteria describe the performance needed to demonstrate achievement of the element.

1.1. Obtain sufficient details to identify map, plan or aerial photo containing the area of land.
1.2. Locate area of land on map, plan or aerial photo using information gathered.

2.1. Establish purpose of plan and map.
2.2. Identify the type of information that can be obtained from different types of plans and maps.
2.3. Obtain information from plan and map to suit intended purpose.
