Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence must satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria. If not otherwise specified the candidate must demonstrate evidence of performance of the following on at least one occasion.

- identifying commonly encountered varieties of fruits, vegetables, field crops, grain products, nursery stock, cut flowers and cut foliage
- recognising pest and disease infestation
- accessing and using statistical information on plants and plant products
- analysing and managing risk related to plant movement health risk
- reading complex and formal documents and applying them to work practices
- presenting information
- adjusting communication to suit different audiences

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence must satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria. If not otherwise specified the depth of knowledge demonstrated must be appropriate to the job context of the candidate.

 - enabling legislation
 - organisational policy and procedures
 - horticultural classifications and families of plants
 - basic physiology of fruits and vegetables
 - basic structures of fruits and vegetables
 - plant and plant products sector
