Application

This unit describes the performance outcomes, skills and knowledge required when exercising regulation, monitoring, inspection and investigation powers under the organisation's enabling and other applicable legislation.

1. Determine regulatory powers.

PERFORMANCE CRITERIA

- 1.4. Identify and confirm acts and omissions that comprise non-compliance or offences under the legislation.

| 3. Identify other applicable legislation and standards. | 3.1. Identify other legislation and standards which impact on regulatory powers and confirm their application and requirements. |

| 4. Work collaboratively with other organisations. | 4.1. Identify organisations that have jurisdictions which overlap and establish and maintain relationships. |
| | 4.2. Identify organisations available to provide assistance and advice and establish relationships for mutual benefit. |
| | 4.3. Follow organisational protocols and procedures when working with other organisations. |
| | 4.4. Refer compliance matters to other organisations for action when required. |
| | 4.5. Follow lead agency protocols and lines of authority during operations involving more than one organisation. |
