Release 1. This is the first release of this unit of competency in the PUA Public Safety Training Package.

Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least two separate occasions and include:

- applying effective communication principles
- analysing a recovery scenario by:
 - confirming the context and cause of the disaster
 - assessing its impact on communities and recovery domains
 - assessing community needs
 - identifying resources required for recovery
 - identifying community groups and stakeholders involved
- documenting and reporting recovery requirements
- developing and amending a recovery plan based on a changing recovery scenario:
 - developing relevant activities addressing community needs
 - outlining arrangements for implementation
 - responding to additional information and changes in situation
- monitoring workload of self, team/others and action appropriately
- participating in agency and interagency briefings and debriefings
- responding to feedback.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- broad phases of community recovery activities:
 - activation
 - relief, which is typically immediate
 - early recovery
 - medium to longer-term recovery
 - transition from recovery to mainstream services/ongoing community development, renewal and regeneration

- effects of disasters on:
 - social environment
 - built environment
 - economic environment
 - natural environment
- funding arrangements
- key recovery roles
- key recovery stakeholders
- prevention, preparedness, response and recovery components of emergency management and how recovery intersects with these
- principles of communication
- psychosocial wellbeing
- recovery concepts and principles
- recovery plans and processes
- recovery resources
- recovery project cycle
- work performance feedback, including:
 - performance and effectiveness
 - team performance and wellbeing
 - work performance
 - personal stress.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations. Where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that reflect workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- applicable documentation, including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) currently used in industry.
