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This unit covers the competency required to observe and/or listen for targets remote from the target acquisition assets and to provide information to stakeholders.

This work will be undertaken as part of a team and under supervision, however it will also require the authority to act independently.

This observation is normally conducted by at least two people; one person will be the observer and one will record the data. This Unit of Competency covers both roles.

1. <b>Occupy and prepare a location</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>1.1 An appropriate vantage point is occupied and concealment is maintained throughout the operation</li><li>1.2 Occupied position is established</li><li>1.3 Reference points are established and information is documented</li><li>1.4 Possible threats are observed and monitored so an appropriate plan of action can be prepared</li></ul>
2. <b>Detect target/s</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>2.1 Target position is established via aural and visual observation, and bearing and distance are estimated</li><li>2.2 Type of weapon (if present) is identified and classified through visual or aural recognition, or by crater analysis</li><li>2.3 Enemy capability is estimated</li><li>2.4 Hostile action is monitored from prepared position</li><li>2.5 Communications with stakeholders is maintained so that relevant information can be provided</li></ul>
3. <b>Provide information on target to stakeholders</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>3.1 Target is described to stakeholders</li><li>3.2 <b><i>Records</i></b> are maintained in accordance with <b><i>standard procedures</i></b></li></ul>

- radar
- aircraft
- watercraft
- armoured vehicles.

Access to an appropriate area and the weapons listed in the Critical Aspects of Evidence.
