Critical aspects for assessment and evidence required to demonstrate competency in this unit

Assessment must confirm the ability to effectively direct and control the mortar operating crew supervise command post activities; to conduct sight testing; and to conduct non-technical inspection.

Consistency in performance

Competency should be demonstrated on operations or in simulated operational environments over time while firing live high explosive ammunition.

Context of and specific resources for assessment

Competency should be assessed in a simulated operational environment.

Specific resources for assessment

Access to a live firing range, mortar crews, at least two mortars and live ammunition.
