- 1. Prepare and deploy mortars
- 1.1 *Resources required* for the performance of the task are determined and organised in accordance with orders
- 1.2 Identified problems/shortfalls are reported to immediate supervisor in accordance with *standard procedures*
- 1.3 Mortars are deployed and the command post is established in accordance with orders
- 1.4 Occupational health and safety (OH&S) requirements and recognised safety precautions are applied throughout the operation
- 2.1 Command post is effectively supervised
- 2.2 Accuracy of all firing data is confirmed
- 2.3 Lay of all weapons are correct before firing
- 2.4 Appropriate firing orders are given to the direct fire support weapon operators
- 2.5 Appropriate *ammunition* is selected in accordance with orders
- 2.6 *Minor incidents* are rectified in accordance with standard procedures
- 2.7 *Major incidents* beyond own level of authority or competence are reported to manager and action is taken as directed
- 3.1 Operator maintenance activities are supervised
- 3.2 Reported defects are rectified within limits of authority or reported to supervisor
- 3.3 *Maintenance* activities are completed in accordance with standard procedures
