# **Unit Descriptor**

**Unit Descriptor** 

This unit covers the competency required to conduct tactical questioning within an operational environment. It also covers searching the detainee prior to questioning.

## **Application of the Unit**

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Conducting tactical questioning will identify detainees suitable for further questioning/interrogation. The process will be conducted as part of a team which will usually include guards. The tactical questioner will not necessarily be an intelligence specialist.

The person being searched and questioned will be detained; the process of handling detainees is not covered by this unit.

Tactical questioning is used in an operational environment to gain information that immediately impacts on the operation. A typical situation would be during the conduct of military operations overseas.

- 1.6 Team members are briefed on their *roles* during the search and questioning in accordance with standard procedures
- 2. Conduct search of detainee
- 2.1 Detainee is *prepared* and escorted to search and questioning site in accordance with standard procedures
- 2.2 Detainee is searched in accordance with standard procedures

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#### **ELEMENT**

#### PERFORMANCE CRITERIA

- 3. Conduct tactical questioning
- 3.1 *Appropriate atmosphere* is created and maintained throughout the activity
- 3.2 Questions are asked of the detainee using appropriate *questioning technique* in accordance with standard procedures
- 3.3 Line of questioning is developed based on responses
- 3.4 Questioning technique is adjusted based on responses
- 3.5 *Legal requirements* are identified and applied during the activity
- 3.6 Occupational health and safety (OH&S) requirements and safety precautions are applied throughout the activity
- 4. Finalise tactical questioning
- 4.1 Responses are recorded and *documentation* is completed in accordance with standard procedures
- 4.2 Detainee is *classified* in accordance with standard procedures
- 4.3 Information gained during search and questioning is provided to *appropriate stakeholders* in a timely manner
