- 1.4 Appropriate consultation with *stakeholders* is conducted in accordance with organisational policy and procedures
- 2.1 Workplace walkthroughs and observations are conducted in accordance with organisational guidelines, legislation and standing operating procedures
- 2.2 Breaches of protocols, plans and local controls are recorded and *reported* in accordance with organisational policies, procedures and guidelines and relevant legislation
- 2.3 Monitoring equipment, where installed, is regularly inspected in accordance with organisational policies, procedures and guidelines and relevant legislation
- 3.1 Workplace hazardous substance records are maintained in accordance with organisational policies, procedures and guidelines, and relevant legislation
- 3.2 Equipment maintenance records/documentation are maintained in accordance with manufacturers' manuals/guidelines and/or organisational policy and procedures
