- 3.2 The exercise plan is used to initiate and facilitate the conduct and direction of the exercise
- 3.3 The progress of the exercise is monitored and feedback provided to personnel
- 4.1 A post exercise debrief is planned based on the conduct and outcomes
- 4.2 A debrief is conducted with activity personnel
- 4.3 The outcomes of the activities are reviewed against objectives
- 4.4 A report of the activity is prepared and distributed to stakeholders
