Plan and prepare for bitumen sprayer operations</p>	<p>1.1 Access, interpret and apply bitumen sprayer operations documentation and ensure the work activity is compliant</p> <p>1.2 Obtain, read, interpret, clarify and confirm work requirements</p> <p>1.3 Identify and address potential risks, hazards and environmental issues, and implement control measures</p> <p>1.4 Select and wear personal protective equipment appropriate for work activities</p> <p>1.5 Confirm and apply environmental protection and safety requirements</p> <p>1.6 Obtain, interpret and implement traffic management signage requirements</p> <p>1.7 Select and check for faults plant, tools and equipment to carry out tasks</p> <p>1.8 Obtain and interpret emergency procedures, and be prepared for fire/accident/emergency</p>
<p>3. Set up sprayer</p>	<p>3.1 Ensure ancillary tanks are full and adequate materials are determined to perform spray operations</p> <p>3.2 Check tank for prevention of contamination</p> <p>3.3 Calculate spraying speed and pump rpm</p> <p>3.4 Introduce correct amount of cutter</p> <p>3.5 Fit appropriate number and size of jets to the spray bar</p>
<p>4. Load sprayer</p>	<p>4.1 Check previous load details for compatibility</p> <p>4.2 Load tank with the prescribed type and quantity of material</p> <p>4.3 Add additives and mix where required</p> <p>4.4 Check, heat and maintain temperature of the material</p> <p>4.4 Measure, calculate and record material quantities and additives</p>
<p>5. Operate bitumen sprayer</p>	<p>5.1 Carry out start-up, park, shutdown and secure equipment procedures</p> <p>5.2 Select and modify bitumen spraying techniques to appropriately meet changing work conditions</p> <p>5.3 Plan work to maximise machine coverage and minimise hand spraying</p> <p>5.4 Set control valves correctly for the type of operation</p> <p>5.5 Drive and operate equipment</p>

	<p>5.6 Conduct, control and monitor spraying operations to ensure materials are sprayed to specification</p> <p>5.7 Carry out operations adjacent to traffic</p> <p>5.8 Complete spraying without damage to property or vehicles</p>
7. Operate hand lance	<p>7.1 Inspect hand lance to ensure correct operation</p> <p>7.2 Select hand lancing techniques to match work conditions</p> <p>7.3 Conduct, control and monitor hand spraying operations</p> <p>7.4 Carry out hand spraying operations adjacent to traffic</p>
8. Unload/empty sprayer	<p>8.1 Unload or empty tank into storage or waste</p> <p>8.2 Clean tank interior and spray bar</p>
9. Carry out operator maintenance	<p>9.1 Prepare machine for maintenance</p> <p>9.2 Conduct inspection and fault finding</p> <p>9.3 Carry out scheduled maintenance tasks</p> <p>9.4 Process written maintenance records</p>
10. Clean up	<p>10.1 Clear work area and dispose of or recycle materials</p> <p>10.2 Clean, check, maintain and store plant, tools and equipment</p> <p>10.3 Carry out housekeeping requirements</p>
