Performance Evidence

Evidence is required to be collected that demonstrates a candidate's competency in this unit. Evidence must be relevant to the roles within this sector's work operations and satisfy all of the requirements of the performance criteria of this unit and include evidence that the candidate:

- · locates and applies relevant legislation, documentation, policies and procedures
- demonstrates completion of development and maintenance of positive community relations that safely, effectively and efficiently meets all of the required outcomes on more than one (1) occasion including:
 - working with others to undertake and complete the development and maintenance of positive community relations
 - provision of clear and timely instruction and supervision of those involved in developing and maintaining positive community relations
 - liaising effectively with a variety of stakeholders
 - producing high quality easy to understand written communications
 - delivering clear and concise presentations
 - networking and forming relationships with a variety of stakeholders
 - planning and managing own work priorities and community relations activities
 - selecting appropriate community relationship strategies
 - overcoming difficulties arising from community relations
 - engaging with people from diverse groups
 - consistent successful positive community relations

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate knowledge of developing and maintaining effective community relations through:

- planning, preparing and conducting positive community relations
- verbal and written communication
- building and maintaining relationships and networks
- time management
- · analysis, evaluation and problem solving
- using technology
- providing leadership
- applying legislation
- applying the organisation's position on current issues
- identifying community activities that could be used to promote the organisation
- applying the organisation's policies, plans and procedures
- applying presentation techniques
- · identifying and managing risk
- complying with documentation, reporting and record keeping requirements
- identifying related organisations, agencies and networks

Assessment Conditions

- An assessor of this unit must satisfy the requirements of the NVR/AQTF or their successors; and Industry regulations for certification and licensing; and,
- this unit is best assessed in the context of this sector's work environment;
- where personal safety or environmental damage are limiting factors, assessment may
 occur in a simulated environment provided it is realistic and sufficiently rigorous to cover
 all aspects of this sector's workplace performance, including environment, task skills, task
 management skills, contingency management skills and job role environment skills; and,
- this unit must be assessed in compliance with relevant legislation/regulation and using policies, procedures, processes and operational manuals directly related to the industry sector for which it is being assessed; and,
- assessment may be conducted in conjunction with the assessment of other Units of Competency; and,
- assessment must confirm consistent performance can be applied in a range of relevant workplace circumstances; and,
- assessors must demonstrate the performance evidence, and knowledge evidence as outlined in this Unit of Competency, and through the minimum years of current* work experience specified below in an Industry sector relevant to the outcomes of the unit; or,

- where the assessor does not meet experience requirements a co-assessment or partnership arrangement must exist between the qualified assessor and an Industry subject matter expert. The Industry subject matter expert should hold the unit being assessed (or an equivalent unit) and/or demonstrate equivalence of skills and knowledge at the unit level. An Industry technical expert must also demonstrate skills and knowledge from the minimum years of current work experience specified below in the Industry sector, including time spent in roles related to the unit being assessed; and,
- assessor and Industry subject matter expert requirements differ depending on the Australian Qualifications Framework Level (AQF) of the qualification being assessed and/or Industry Sector as follows:

Industry sector	AQF** Level	Required assessor or Industry subject matter expert experience
Drilling, Metalliferous Mining, Coal Mining, Extractive (Quarrying) and Civil	1	1 Year
Construction	2	2 Years
Drilling, Coal Mining and Extractive (Quarrying)	3-6	3 Years
Metalliferous Mining and Civil Construction	3-6	5 Years
Other sectors	Where this Unit is being assessed outside of the Resources and Infrastructure Sectors assessor and/or Industry subject matter expert experience should be in-line with industry standards for the sector in which it is being assessed and where no Industry standard is specified should comply with any relevant regulation.	

^{*}Assessors can demonstrate current work experience through employment within Industry in a role relevant to the outcomes of the Unit; or, for external assessors this can be demonstrated through exposure to Industry by conducting frequent site assessments across various locations.
