Participate in fire drills	<p>4.1 Recognise and comply with fire alarm signals</p> <p>4.2 Attend and participate in emergency drills and safety meetings</p> <p>4.3 Operate portable extinguishing equipment, fire hose and nozzles</p> <p>4.4 Identify and comply with fire team instructions</p> <p>4.5 Identify assigned fire/boat station and follow procedures</p>
