RIIERR405 Control emergencies and critical situations

Modification History

This unit replaces RIIERR304D Control emergencies and critical situations. Minor endorseable amendments have been made to Elements, Performance Criteria, Foundation Skills, Performance Evidence and Knowledge Evidence to better reflect current industry practices and clarify training outcomes.

Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to control emergencies and critical situations and coordinate responses in the resources and infrastructure industries.

It applies to those who work in supervisory roles. They are generally responsible for the outcomes of others, contribute to the development of solutions to non-routine problems, and apply management plans in the workplace.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Foundation Skills

Skill	Description
Problem solving	Applies problem solving processes to identify risks, evaluate options and determine solutions
Oral communication	Conveys information and requirements clearly, and listens carefully
Reading	Identifies and interprets relevant information from workplace procedures, documentation, legislation and regulations
