<p>1. Plan and prepare for underground stockpiling</p>	<p>1.1. Access, interpret and apply stockpile maintenance documentation, and ensure the work activity is compliant</p> <p>1.2. Obtain, interpret, clarify and confirm work instructions</p> <p>1.3. Select and wear personal protective equipment appropriate for work activities</p> <p>1.4. Inspect and assess site conditions and determine if scaling is required and take action</p> <p>1.5. Identify, address and report potential risks, hazards and environmental issues</p> <p>1.6. Obtain and interpret emergency procedures, and be prepared for fire/accident/emergency</p> <p>1.7. Use approved dust suppression and extraction methods</p> <p>1.8. Ensure work area is well ventilated before</p>
<p>2. Stockpile materials</p>	<p>2.1. Ensure stockpile site has adequate ground support and is accessible</p> <p>2.2. Place stockpile materials in correct location to ensure efficient identification and access, and to prevent mixing of materials</p> <p>2.3. Drive and operate equipment according to manufacturer's instructions and avoiding damage to the stockpile and surrounding site</p> <p>2.4. Use appropriate stockpiling techniques to maximise the capacity of the stockpiling site</p> <p>2.5. Identify and remove contaminants</p>
<p>3. Carry out post operational procedures</p>	<p>3.1. Clean and maintain condition of equipment, ensure suitability for use, and address/report issues</p> <p>3.2. Clean and store auxiliary service equipment</p> <p>3.3. Complete housekeeping requirements</p> <p>3.4. Process written and verbal recording and reporting requirements</p>
