Operate light vehicle	<p>2.1 Carry out pre-start, start-up, park-up and shutdown procedures</p> <p>2.2 Operate light vehicle</p> <p>2.3 Operate equipment within recommended speed, engine capability and limitations</p> <p>2.4 Use vehicle lights and indicators in accordance with traffic regulations</p> <p>2.5 Identify and respond appropriately to hazardous and/or emergency driving situations</p> <p>2.6 Complete light vehicle operations according to work plan</p>
3. Carry out operator maintenance	<p>3.1 Conduct visual inspections to identify faults</p> <p>3.2 Conduct routine operational servicing and housekeeping activities</p> <p>3.3 Carry out minor maintenance and repairs</p> <p>3.4 Report defective or irregular performance</p> <p>3.5 Maintain and update vehicle written records</p>
